- D. Approval of a Neighborhood Purpose Grant in the amount of \$1,000.00 to the North Valley YMCA's annual Thanksgiving dinner program for needy and disadvantaged families in the North Valley. Funds will be used to purchase food items for a traditional Thanksgiving dinner for those in need. Goal this year is to reach 3500 families.

PLUM (Cindy Wu Freedman)

- A. Motion by the PLUM committee to support the GHNNC Neighborhood Council to change the City Notification system by amending Section 16.05(G)(3) of the Los Angeles Municipal Code. This amendment would allow Neighborhood Councils to require a public hearing on developments during the planning process.
- B. Motion; PLUM committee recommends the appointment of three additional Stakeholders to the committee; Larry Yoder, Terri Weeks and Eric Mansker.
- C. Motion; PLUM committee recommends the Board submit a community impact statement an opt/in procedure for the Sidewalk vending/Special sidewalk vending district program, with a default position of no sidewalk vending within Council District 12 should an opt in/opt out procedure not be included in the ordinance CF#13-1493.
- D. Motion; PLUM committee recommends disapproval for a conditional use permit for off-site sale of alcoholic beverages at 17020 Chatsworth (Walgreens) unless the

applicant complies with the same guidelines as spray can monitoring regulations. (Case ENV-2017-3557-CE & ZA-2010-1302-CUB-PA1)

In addition, if you would like a copy of any record related to an item on the agenda, please contact Julie Carson at jcarson@ghsnc.org. As a covered entity under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act, the City of Los Angeles does not discriminate on the basis of disability and upon request, will provide reasonable accommodation to ensure equal access to its programs, services, and activities. Meetings may be recorded. Note that any stakeholder comments must be made during the appropriate public comment period, and either during an individual's allotted time or if an individual stakeholder has been invited to speak by a board member. Audience members may not approach the board during a meeting except to hand out materials during the allotted speaking time, and then only with the permission of the presiding officer. If a stakeholder has any requests that cannot be addressed during the allotted speaking time, the items may be e--mailed to the board or to our Secretary.

Note that Government Code section 54957.9 provides: In the event that any meeting is willfully interrupted by a group or groups of persons so as to render the orderly conduct of such meeting unfeasible and order cannot be restored by the removal of individuals who are willfully interrupting the meeting, the members of the legislative body conducting the meeting may order the meeting room cleared and continue in session. Only matters appearing on the agenda may be considered in such a session. Representatives of the press or other news media, except those participating in the disturbance, shall be allowed to attend any session held pursuant to this section. Nothing in this section shall prohibit the legislative body from establishing a procedure for readmitting an individual or individuals not responsible for willfully disturbing the orderly conduct of the meeting.

Please note further that Penal Code section 403 states: Every person who, without authority of law, willfully disturbs or breaks up any assembly or meeting that is not unlawful in its character, other than an assembly or meeting referred to in Section 302 of the Penal Code or Section 18340 of the Elections Code, is guilty of a misdemeanor. The board reserves its rights to exercise appropriate remedies in the event of disruption of board or committee meetings.
