

#### **Funding Request: NVCS Year-End Community Celebration Series**

North Valley Caring Services (NVCS) is a nonprofit community center located in North Hills, California, dedicated to serving low-income and homeless individuals and families across the San Fernando Valley. Founded in 1996 as an official nonprofit—though its roots date back to 1978, when founder Verna Porter began a community breakfast program—NVCS has grown into one of the largest and most comprehensive service providers in the area.

Over the decades, NVCS has expanded from offering meals to delivering a wide range of programs that address food insecurity, homelessness, education, and community wellness. #### 3. Holiday Celebration - December



The purpose of applying for grant funding for our FIRST Tech Challenge (FTC) robotics team is to support and expand opportunities for students to engage in hands-on, project-based STEM education. STEM initiatives, like FTC, provide students with valuable real-world problem-solving skills, foster creativity, while encouraging teamwork, leadership, and gracious professionalism. Through these experiences, students gain not only technical knowledge but also critical thinking and collaboration skills that will serve them well in future academic and career pursuits. The goal is to inspire the next generation of innovators and equip them with the tools to succeed in an increasingly technology-driven world.

5) How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public at-large. (Grants cannot be used as rewards or prizes for individuals)

We are requesting these funds for purchasing robot parts for the construction of our two FIRST Tech Challenge competition robots (for our 30+ team members), new 3-D printers to speed up prototyping and optimization of mechanisms, FTC field elements for the 25-26 competition season, and FIRST Lego League kits to provide resources and mentorship to local elementary school robotics teams in support of STEM education and engagement. This year, our team has participated in a number of outreach opportunities including being a featured presenter at the annual Dearborn Elementary Charter Academy's STEAM night, hosting the VAAS STEAM night, and running a booth at the LAUSD Region North STEAM Fest held at the Discovery Cube. Additionally, our student members volunteered at the Holmes annual VEX competition, mentored students at Andasol Elementary School to provide ongoing support to their VEX IQ robotics team, and promoted STEM excitement through our social media Instagram account. If we receive this NPG funding, we will seek to continue mentoring Andasol, and expand our impact/mentorship to other nearby elementary schools (Granada Elementary, and Mayall Elementary).
